It can be run way more effectively than what it is-it is not producing the results needed in alot of the centers it is in. It is being run by unprofessional people without the skill set ,qualifications and experience to do this work. This should not be allowed to continue as millions of dollars are being spent on keeping this service alive ,where by it should be given to another provider that can /will produce the results its meant too.

If there can be an effective service at this stage in a childs life-then research does say that this will affect mental health and reduce crime and overall spending as a whole. This programme done well, has the potential to save this country millions of dollars.

We have been able to do this at a local level and I have no doubt that this can be done well at a national level but will not happen with current leadership of this programme.

It is so frsutrating to see millions of dollars spent on ineffective people and organisations that continue to present ,less than satisfactory outcomes.

Salaries neeed to be realistic, so to attaract good'qualified staff to do this work as it is complex and challenging. We have Ngo staff being paid up to half the amount that their colleagues are being paid for doing the main work-in the home and holding the stress and pressure-this is not ok and needs to change immediately. This would seem crazy as we are paid by the same people-Oranga Tamariki!!

My hope is that these points be taken seriously as they are key to getting real about working with children and their families.

I would enjoy the opportunity to speak more to these points, however I dont hold alot of hope that anything I have said here will be taken seriously. I can only hope that one person sees some truth in this and is prepeared to stand up and push through with-what I believe to be some cold hard , true facts and most importantly a way forward for our families/whanu in this country.
