### **Submission Content**

#### The Proposed Outcomes Framework:

The five wellbeing domains are portrayed as five separate aspects when in fact they are all required to achieve the wellbeing of children and young people. New Zealand is the best place in the world for children when young people are loved, nutured and safe; have what they need; belong, contribute and are valued; are happy and healthy, and are learning and developing. They must all be applied for the wellbeing of children and young people.

The enablers, role models, mentors, teachers, etc. must all be involved as they are the influencers.

The 16 focus areas are all valid but should not be numbered as this gives the idea of a priority or order of working.

It is important to make it easier to eat healthy food and to undertake physical activity (e.g. to walk or bike rather than ride).

The importance of play involving physical activity should be included. To play is to have fun and to learn through creating activity.

There is a need to restrict access to advertising which targets young people. The messaging they can receive through accessing the media is often from international sources.

Government should place a health lens over everything they do, including legislation and policy development. Parents are responsible for their children, and Council, Government and services supporting parents should be enabling parents to parent correctly.

Councils have a role when development is occuring. Does the planning involve a family lens? Do people need a car to access everyday things? Are green areas stimulating for different generations? Do facilities provide areas to play?

We look forward to working with our community as together Invercargill and New Zealand become the best place in the world for children.
